

### Highlights of the September 24, 2024 Stated Session Meeting

A stated Session meeting was held on September 24, 2024. Carolyn Hatfield presented a devotional on feeling joy in simple things reminding us to "Find joy, express joy, look for goodness. It is there!" Carolyn opened the meeting with prayer.

Session reviewed the Financial Summary for August. Two months into the fiscal year, we are on track with pledges received and expenditures. Youth ministry is off to a great start with good attendance at the first three youth group gatherings. The first Covenant Forum, let by Pastor Tom in October, will be discussion of the documentary "Bad Faith" on the danger of Christian Nationalism. Attendees are encouraged to watch the documentary beforehand.

Mission and Outreach Ministry Team will formulate a policy for "Discussion and approval of personal or group requests to leave flyers or information at the church" for review at the next Session meeting.

Session approved a motion that couples will not serve on Session together, and the service of partners in a couple must be separated by one year. Exceptions to this policy must be considered by Session on a case-by-case basis.

Bert Ballard-Myer shared that many ways of addressing the traffic jam in front of the church during the food distribution have been discussed and tried. The arrangement we have with cones and two people directing two lanes of traffic is the best method we've come up with so far. We would have to pay an officer \$40/hour to direct traffic.

Bob Brewster reported that the elder nominating committee is working on nominations for the next class of elders and welcomes suggestions from the Session and congregation of members with potential interest in serving as Elders.

Session approved a motion from the Worship Ministry Team to purchase 175 New Revised Standard Version Bibles from Cokesbury at \$10.99/each for a total of \$1923.25. The funds will be taken out of the Carol Wheeler Memorial Fund.

There was a discussion on purchase of 2017 Mercedes 15-passenger diesel van with a wheelchair lift that is for sale. More information is being gathered.

Session approved a motion from the Personnel Committee to transfer \$2,500 from Covenant's General Funds into a temporary restricted account for childcare expenses (fund #009600) and use those funds to increase the rate of pay and cover the full budget for our childcare & nursery worker from 2024-2025.

Covenant will be hosting the Holiday Benevolence Market on December 8th.

Covenant will host training by Athens Pride and Queer Collective (APQC) on gender theory, pronoun usage and sexuality for youth group leaders and parents. B & G is purchasing a hot water heater for the CE hallway bathrooms. A utility sink will be installed in the Journey classroom.

The Fall picnic was a huge success with 96 attendees. Four remaining Fellowship events of the year are: October 6 – World Communion Sunday reception (grapes and bread), November 24 – "Hanging of the Greens" holiday decorating and soup lunch, December 6 – Progressive Dinner, December 15 – Choral Worship Reception. Congregational Care Ministry Team will meet October 20<sup>th</sup> to prepare Halloween Cards for college students and homebound members.

Fellowship and Congregational Care are working together on updating a photo directory.

Tom thanked everyone involved in his Installation Service. He reminded everyone that will be out of town October 4-8. Tom expressed that we have had quite a few repeat visitors lately. He would like to put out a call for people to consider becoming members.

Session approved a motion to start the October 22nd and the combined November/December meeting on December 3, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.
