**Green Dream Team News**—The Green Dream Team Planning Committee met with Hank Tweedell (resident expert on building maintenance) for a walk-through of Covenant and discussion of possible improvements to our facility. Caly DePalma, now Chair of Building and Grounds Ministry Team joined us for this discussion on Wednesday afternoon. Hank mentioned that many updates/ improvements have been made to the facility in recent years. Some examples are: 2 water heaters have been replaced (CE building and Kitchen); Lights have mostly been changed to LED bulbs; and he stated that the roof is good and that there is ample insulation for the building. There are some areas for improvement, such as checking the Thermal Air Flow to detect Infiltration; replacing remaining incandescent bulbs with LED bulbs; changing air filters more frequently; and upgrading Thermostats to Internet-capable ones (in order to regulate the temperature better, when the building is unoccupied). These are some of the items we discussed, which we would like to discuss further at an upcoming GDT meeting (possibly in April).

We all agreed that this discussion was enlightening and has given us ideas for action items for the Green Dream Team, Building and Grounds, and others who might wish to get involved. Hank has also said he is willing to come to a GDT Meeting and facilitate this discussion and answer questions. *Thank you, Hank!* We look forward to continuing this discussion with you. This month the Green Dream Team will meet on March 23, at 12:15pm in the Covenant Library. Please bring a Brown Bag Lunch and join us! We will have a Guest Speaker at our meeting- Pam Knox, Covenant member and Meteorologist! She will speak on Climate Change and the effects on our Environment. Pam speaks regularly to many groups, local and away, and recently spoke with our Covenant PW on this topic. As we have mentioned earlier, our Covenant PW is studying Environmental Justice for our current Bible Study. Pam did an excellent job with her presentation to us and we are delighted that she is willing to speak with the GDT this month! Thank you, Pam!
