One Palm Sunday, little Johnny was sick and stayed home from church. When his brothers and sisters came home carrying palm branches, Johnny asked where the palms came from. His father replied, "When Jesus walked by, people held palm branches over his head." "Just my luck!" Johnny said. "The one time I don't go to church, Jesus shows up."

Parents/Caregiver learning note: Easter is here! For the first time since 1956, Easter Sunday falls on April 1 - or April Fool's Day. Quite a juxtaposition of days! Since 1900, Easter has fallen on April Fool's Day only four times - 1923, 1934, 1945 and 1956. It won't happen again until 2029. The time when Christians around the world celebrate the resurrection of Christ, Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the spring equinox. The spring equinox occurs on March 20 this year. Easter generally falls between March 22 and April 25 each year. We will focus on the resurrection story from Matthew 28 for much of April, as we celebrate our Risen Lord!


