As we move into the summer months, we are excited that our youth and children will continue to have rich opportunities to grow in their faith and discipleship to Jesus: VBS, in partnership with First Presbyterian Church, is right around the corner and will be followed by our senior highs heading for the Montreat Youth Conference the first week of June. Over six Wednesdays in June and July, Kickin' It at Covenant will offer a weekly gathering to study scripture and enjoy ice cream and recreation together. And later in June, our middlers and their leaders will be traveling to Massanetta, Virginia for a middle school youth conference. The organizational leadership behind all this comes from many dedicated volunteers, but is finally pulled together by our Director of Children and Youth ministry Craig Topple. It's hard to believe that Craig has been with us for almost a year now, and we rejoice in the gifts that he brings to our community. In the coming fiscal year, Craig has requested that his hours be reduced to half-time so that he can pursue ministry in the other sphere of his vocation as a hospital chaplain with St. Mary's Healthcare. Most of you will still see Craig around here the same way you have this year, and his wife Trasie and their children Ruby Gene and Zia will remain active members in our worshiping life and Covenant Connection. Covenant leadership will be looking for help leading the Cave and Sunday evening youth fellowship specifically and has already started this process. Personnel, the pastors, and the session all feel like this is a workable move and believe that it would be in the best interest of our young people and their families not to look for a full-time replacement for Craig, but to enable him to keep building the relationships he has established over the past year. We also think that his continued leadership, even in a part-time capacity, will help us to discern the best staffing configuration for Covenant once Beecher retires in September 2019. We are grateful for the many fruits of children and youth ministry that have been born in our first year with Craig, and we can't wait to see where God will be leading us in the days to come.
