





6 Things You're Recycling Wrong — Can you recycle coffee cups or greasy pizza boxes? If you're tossing things in the recycling bin out of sheer hope, you might be an "aspirational recycler." We have all done it: a greasy pizza box, a disposable coffee cup, the odd plastic bag. Sometimes, we want things to be recyclable, so we put them in the recycling bin. Waste managers often call this wishful or aspirational recycling. But, unfortunately, putting these objects in with the rest of the recycling can do more harm than good. While rules differ in every municipality (https://www.athensclarkecounty.com/209/Recycling-Waste-Reduction), we have picked out some key offenders to keep in mind. Too many of these items will contaminate a batch of recycling.
