There is a box on the congregational desk for your donations! Last year Rich reached 500 low income residents of Roatan and provided them with eye glasses and medications.





Meet Our Neighbor Katia – Covenant has recently become a member congregation of the Interfaith Sanctuary Coalition (ISC), a group of Athens area faith communities committed to offering friendship, hope, and compassionate support to our undocumented neighbors. Through ISC we have met Katia, a 19 year-old mother of two who has lived in Athens for 17 years. Her husband was deported to Mexico a few months ago, leaving Katia with her mother and sister to try and make ends meet. Currently Katia is working some shifts at a local flea market. In the fall she will be returning to school, seeking to complete her high school education through an on-site, on-line program at the ACC School District office. Here are some ways we can help Katia immediately and in the months to come: *By providing Lyft gift cards or a bus pass so that she can get to work and run errands

*By offering rides to school several times a week in the fall (once we know her schedule we will set up a Sign-Up genius for volunteer drivers)

*By supplying her with plastic storage bins and age-appropriate books for her children (she has a one year-old boy and a three year-old girl)

*By sharing information about local, private cosmetology schools and helping fund her tuition

Thank you for prayerfully considering entering into this relationship with Katia and her family. In these days when many of us are rightly focused on legislative efforts to enable parents and children to stay together along our borders, this is a chance to extend gospel love to a vulnerable family that is already here.

As one of my teachers likes to say, "Justice is good, but supper is essential!"

"Try it - you may like it! ".

into a sacred story. It is within these walls that songs and stories of faith are learned for a lifetime.

Lives with young children are busy to be sure! If my daughters participate in something, I want to have confidence it is worth the time and effort. Each teacher and helper seeks to meet that expectation, as they delights in the privilege of being part of nurturing our children's faith. WoRM becomes one of the few opportunities our children have to learn about the Bible and how the stories begin to shape their lives and the way they see the world. We see it as a foundational part of their development.

WoRM, stands for Workshop Rotation Model. Grouped as K-2nd and 3rd-5th graders, children rotate each month to the four workshops:

Oasis Theatre--the Story through drama;

Temple Courtyard--The Story through creative games;

Loaves and Fishes--the Story through cooking and/or science;

Potters Workshop--The Story through crafts.

Participants needed for a UGA Kinesiology research study involving a group exercise program for older adults:

CHAMPS: Changing Activity, Maintaining Physical function Study

Who? Couples 60-80 years old with internet access.

What? Complete initial online screening (takes ~10 minutes) to determine possible eligibility.

Visit our lab in UGA's Ramsey Center, for baseline physical function testing visits (~2 hours).

The exercise program will last about 10 weeks with classes twice per week on TUES/THURS for ~1.5 hours between 8:00AM and 11:00AM, and will be held in the Center for Physical Activity and Health.

What do I gain? In addition to meeting new friends and gaining exercise education and health benefits, upon successful completion of initial visits, physical activity classes, and follow-up visits, you will be provided with a Fitbit and a free 2-month membership to the Center for Physical Activity and Health (CPAH), which is valued at \$70.00.
