*Parents Corner*: "What is it?!" It's not unusual for me to suggest to my girls they try a new food. First question they ask, "What is it!?" Any of you remember the original name for the Atlanta Olympic games mascot? "Whatizit!" "What is it!?" That's what the Israelites asked when they saw "manna" for the first time, "What is it!?" In November, we continue our Exodus journey, which will be the last visit to this dramatic story in WoRM for the school year (we'll be back in Egypt after the birth of Jesus). Like a frog, we leap over the plagues (feel free to look through those with your child(ren)), and emerge on the other side of the "Red Sea" (Exodus 15:22). This emergence could be seen as a birth or even a baptism--the Israelites are a new creation, who now have to figure out what this new life is all about. It's hard! So, it should be no surprise there is a fair amount of "grumbling" as they "wander in the wilderness" for 40 years. Moses and his brother Aaron have their hands full of challenging "children." But, the story is preserved because it is a story of struggle, identity, and growth, alongside God's liberation, faithfulness, and provision. Quail and Manna rain down from heaven! Water springs forth from rocks! The people of God learn to live in community, to trust God will provide, to take only what they need, and to take Sabbath rest. Continue to read through chapters 15 - 17 with your children--before going to bed, after supper, whenever is convenient. I'd love to hear any questions that surface in these readings. This story has inspired peoples for generations. Now it's our children's turn to get caught up in the Story of God found in these pages! **Remember:** Please help prepare your children for WoRM by telling them who their teacher and shepherd are and where their lesson will be: Temple Courtyard, Potter's Workshop, Loaves and Fishes, or Oasis Theatre. The renovation of Loaves and Fishes room is complete! Items have been moved back in, and lessons will begin again as part of the rotation. Many thanks to those who helped make this wonderful renovation happen!
