**Parents Corner** For the three weeks leading up to Easter, we go to the "Garden of Gethsemane." Work on spelling that word with your child. Try to locate it on a map of the city of Jerusalem. Jesus is outside the city gates. It is the night before his arrest. His last act as a free man is to take his closest companions with him to a place of prayer. Interestingly, Luke does not include the name of the garden as other gospels do; the evangelist just refers to it "the place." Places become sacred as they facilitated a desire to become close to God. As you see in the memory verse above, the heart of Jesus' prayer is one of intention--"remove this cup;" as well as submission, "not my will, but Thine" (nothing quite does it like the King James translations in instances like these). So much is happening in these few passages which speak to our faith journey. The importance of companionship, the importance of naming our intentions, the importance of surrendering to that which is out of our control, trusting God is present in the midst of all of it. These concepts are probably better understood, initially, when our children are in their mid-teens; and that is just the beginning of their understanding. Sometimes they are not understood at all by people of faith, who would prefer to gloss over the suffering narrative and get straight to the "good stuff" of Easter. But, the garden of Gethsemane is at the crux of the spiritual journey; and exposing our younger children to this portion of the faith narrative, may make it not only more easy to comprehend at a laters stage of life, but also a very valuable lesson to cling to when suffering comes knocking on their door, which it inevitably will do. This may seem like a gloomy lesson to engage with our children for the weeks leading up to Easter, but doesn't the contrast make the Easter celebration that much sweeter?!
