

## Going underground with WoRM! "let the little children come unto me." - Jesus

**Parents Corner**: Recently I listened to the following podcast, "Becoming Wise" in which Krista Tippet had a conversation with Sandy Eisenberg Sasso--rabbi emerita of Congregation Beth-El Zedeck in Indianapolis, where she was spiritual leader for 36 years. Her books for adults and children include "God's Paintbrush" and "Midrash: Reading the Bible with Question Marks". Here is a slightly abridged portion of the interview as you may consider your involvement with the spiritual nurturing of the children of Covenant Presbyterian.

**Tippett:** What advice do you give parents who come to you and ask, "How do I nurture this aspect of my child's being that I may not understand myself? How do I give them experiences of the sacred?"

Rabbi Sasso: "If we're going to nurture the spiritual lives of our children we have to nurture our own spiritual lives. We have to take time in our lives to reflect, perhaps be part of a community that talks about issues of spirituality, to read. When we [first become] parents, we're clueless about what we're supposed to do. We read books — how to feed them, how to bring them up, how to get them to sleep, how to potty-train them. We ought to also engage in educating ourselves about our own spiritual lives because it's very difficult to share with children what you're thinking if you haven't been thinking about these issues... Most of what we do in terms of nurturing our children's spirituality really happens when no one else is looking — meaning, it's not all planned for. It's what happens every day. What do you do when you see a homeless person on the street? How do you respond when an animal gets run over on the road, a squirrel, for example? How do we act with other people? All of these are messages to our children about what really matters in life, what's precious, what's more important than earning a living and going through our daily routine. Society does a very good job in teaching us how to be consumers and a very good job in teaching us how to be competitors. The question I think parents are struggling to answer is, how do we not just teach our children's minds, but how do we teach their souls? And that's a much deeper question. I know we want our children to be more than consumers and competitors. We want something much more. We want our children to be gracious and grateful. We want them to have courage in difficult times. We want them to have a sense of joy and purpose. That's what it means to nurture their spiritual lives."

Late July Chips: The Rock Stars of Chips! Why are Late July Chips the ROCK STARS of chips? It's because the Late July company partners with TerraCycle to reward the groups that collect Late July Chip bags. The reward is two-part: 1. UPS labels are provided for shipping boxes of Late July Chip bags to TerraCycle. 2. For every 2 lbs. of chip bags shipped, the collecting organization is paid \$1.00. This is not true for all the other brands of chip/salty snack bags.

If you only like potato chips, then <u>Late July Chips</u> are not for you, but if you like corn and multigrain chips, be sure to look for <u>Late July Chips</u>. At Kroger, the large bags of Chia & Quinoa Tortilla Chips and Sub-Lime Multigrain Tortilla Chips are on sale through July 23. Kroger and other stores carry additional flavors, shapes and colors of organic corn chips.
