The Reverend Jimmie Hawkins: Director of the Presbyterian Church (USA) Office of Public Witness

Rev. Jimmie Ray Hawkins earned a Bachelor of Arts in Social Studies from North Carolina Central University (Durham, NC); a Master of Arts in Christian Education from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (Richmond, VA); and a Master of Divinity from the Interdenominational Theological Center/Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary (Atlanta, GA).

For twenty years he served as the pastor of Covenant Presbyterian Church in Durham, NC, 1996 - 2016. Between 1992 - 1996, he served as the senior pastor of Grace Presbyterian, Holmes Memorial and Trinity Presbyterian churches in western Virginia.

He served as Treasurer on the Church World Service global board and as a board member of the National Council of Churches. He served as trustee on the board of Union Presbyterian Seminary. He has chaired several interfaith/ecumenical and non-profit boards: Durham Congregations in Action, the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance, the Religious Coalition for a Non-Violent Durham, Housing for New Hope (homeless advocacy, End Poverty Now), and others.

His community ministry includes being a leader for the Moral Monday Movement since its onset in 2013. He has participated in three actions of civil disobedience protesting the actions of the NC General Assembly to curtail voting rights, refusal to expand Medicaid, HB2 and other draconian legislation. He served as a member of the NC NAACP Executive Committee and has been active in justice advocacy throughout his ministry.

He is the son of Elsie L. and the late James P. Hawkins. He is married to Sheinita Hampton Hawkins and they have two children: Kaela Renee and James Hampton.

2020, ACC/UGA Combined Arbor Day Celebration – February 14th, 2020 at 2:00 PM

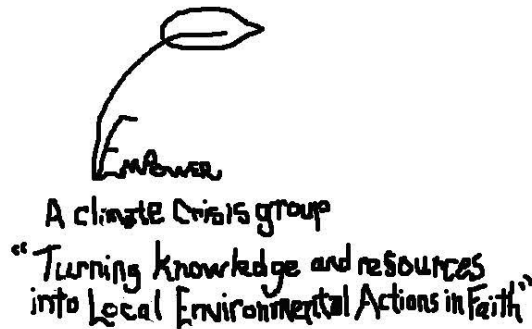
The Athens Mayor has signed a proclamation to officially declare February 14th, 2020 as Athens' Arbor Day. Athens has recently been designated as a Tree City USA for the 20th year in a row by the National Arbor Day Founda-

tion. This honor has been bestowed to Athens Clarke County in recognition of Athens' dedication to the care of the trees that help define the character of our community and make it such a special place.

Representatives from Athens Clarke County (ACC), the University of Georgia (UGA), The Community Tree Council (CTC), the Georgia Forestry Commission (GFC), and Keep Athens Clarke County Beautiful (KACCB) will meet up on a completed section of the Firefly Trail (between S. Peter St. and Inglewood Ave.) where nine new trees are to be planted. The CTC has donated nine balled and burlapped trees to Athens Clarke County from the Trees for Tomorrow Program for the Firefly Trail. The CTC, ACC's Landscape Management, and Leisure Services were involved in the planning of the tree planting project. ACC's Landscape Management's Parks crews will be digging the planting holes and placing the trees in their new locations. UGA has engaged as a partner in open collaboration with the Athens Community by providing and assistance and KACCB has served in an advisory role for the tree planting project.

The Combined Arbor Day event is a celebration of the collaboration of our community partners for the purpose of improving the quality of life for Athens Clarke County's citizens through the planting and maintenance of trees. The Athens Arbor Day Celebration will consist of backfilling the holes of the newly planted trees with soil on a section of the newly constructed Firefly Trail (between S. Peter St. and Inglewood Ave). Mulch will then be spread around the trees to help improve their planting sites. An official representative of Athens Clarke County will read the Athens Arbor Day Proclamation. The celebration will conclude with the Georgia Forestry Commission giving away free bare root saplings. The public is invited to attend. A Free bare root sapling will be given to participants, who will be encouraged to plant and nurture in a suitable location for the benefit of future Athenians. Please note, parking may limited. The Firefly Trail will need to be accessed either by walking up the ramp onto the trail bridge from Poplar Street, from Peter Street, or from Inglewood Ave. Limited parking may be found at 286 S Poplar St, 354 S Peter Street, or in a safe parking place along S Poplar Street, S Peter Street, or Inglewood Ave. Please be prepared to walk one or more blocks and make sure to dress for the weather.
