

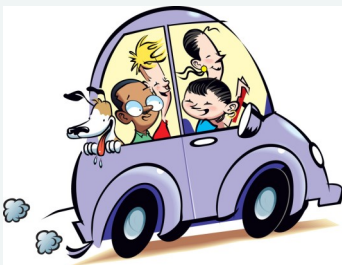

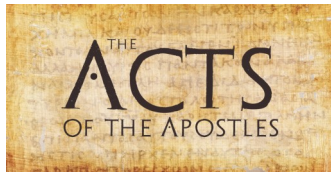

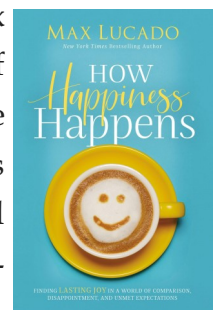

## **Discussion of the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year Approved Budget**

This is the second part of my discussion of the current state of Covenant's finances. Last week I provided a financial summary of the 2019-2020 fiscal year, which you can find in the August 9 Covenant. This week I present the final approved budget for the July 2020-June 2021 fiscal year. The original proposed budget we sent out during the pledge drive was for \$525,230. It was ambitious but one we thought was possible. After the pledge drive began, the coronavirus drastically changed our lives and our worship at Covenant, moving us to online services and the end of all other in-person activities. Through it all, you gave faithfully to Covenant and our receipts almost exactly matched our pledges. However, the pledges we received for the 2020-2021 fiscal year were only \$450,000, which was slightly less than what we received in pledges in 2019-2020 (\$461,484). I am sure that the uncertainty about jobs, health, and what the church should be doing in these unprecedented times all figured into your individual pledge amounts. As a result, the Finance Ministry Team asked each church ministry team to reassess what their needs were, assuming that there would be no in-person church through September, and each team provided us with an updated budget request. This reduced the total amount to about \$507,000. However, we felt that budget remained too high considering the pledges, especially since our other sources of income from rent and non-pledged giving have also been cut back severely.

The Finance Ministry Team also discussed the large surplus that we had in the 2019-2020 net budget, which I described last week. After consideration, we suggested to Session that some of the line items such as those for Montreat, a digital piano, and the mission trip be funded for 2020-2021 by using the excess income from last fiscal year to create a group of 1-year Special Restricted Accounts (SRAs) to pay for those items. If those accounts are not used (for example, if no mission trip is taken) then those SRAs would be closed and the amounts returned to the general fund. Session agreed and the budget was approved. You can see those SRAs listed at the bottom of the 2020-2021 approved budget with asterisks on the associated lines in the approved budget in the right-hand column.

Highlights of the approved budget include raises of 2 percent for all personnel to offset rising costs of living. We also provided an increase for Asher Hill, who has taken on added responsibilities for videotaping and producing our YouTube services, and an increase for Rindy Trouteaud to compensate her for her current workload. It also includes a position for a part-time neighborhood coordinator. Session members will also note a slight change in the compensation for Kim, our piano accompanist, since we forgot to change her compensation from 10 months last year (she started in September) to 12 months in the current fiscal year. The Community Outreach Ministry Team also recommended a restructuring of our local outreach gifts to better reflect the current neighborhood needs that Covenant is responding to. If you have questions about this section, then you may wish to contact Paige Campbell, the head of that ministry team, for more information. The rest of the changes, which are mostly quite small, came from adjustments by other ministry teams.

Note that because of the uncertainty about when we can return to in-person worship, we plan to reevaluate the budget in January so that it reflects how the church actually operated in the last quarter of 2020 and the current status of the pandemic, which is still unknown. In the meantime, please contact me if you have additional questions about the budget and I will be happy to try to address them.





#### Cov Presby Landscape Improvements—



Landscaping improvements at Cov Presby have finally reached the stage of visible notice. Following a design prepared by Victory Landscapes of Bogart, GA, a variety of new green and flowering shrubs may now be seen along the sidewalk in front of the Fellowship Hall as well as surrounding the street side of the front patio. Note the photos. Work around the front yard sign is progressing, as newly installed trees enclose it together with additional plantings to come. Alex Clark and Hank Tweedell have installed and tweaked the operational irrigation system that will aid in maintaining this new landscaping. Andrew Zimdars and Ben Bruner have removed and transplanted to the back yard much of the liriopse and most of the iron plants that were formerly out front. Monies from the Andrew Ministry Team and the Building & Grounds Ministry Team funded these efforts. Enjoy! Hopefully, “mulch” more is to come.

UGA students built a Little Food Pantry on our church campus. It is located outside the doors of our fellowship hall. Little Food Pantries are scattered throughout Athens, and their purpose is to respond to the emergency food needs of hungry folks. We encourage you to help us keep our Little Food Pantry stocked with pop-top single serve canned goods that do not require cooking, peanut butter and jelly, packaged crackers, healthy snack items. Small individual personal hygiene items (ie: soap, deodorant, toothbrush and toothpaste, and shampoos) in a zip lock bag with a granola bar of some kind is also needed. Please remember everything must be sealed to prevent ant infestations...



**The Covenant coffee closet** still has lots of coffee, tea, and hot chocolate ! Although the regular office hours and services are suspended, the church is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays for the Food Pantry from 1 - 4 PM. *Please call the church office at 706-548-2756 and place your order and when you would like to pick it up. A food pantry volunteer will hand your order as you drive through the parking lot.* In this time of uncertainty, let's not forget the hard working farmers and their families who depend on the Equal Exchange folks to buy their coffee at a Fair Price !!!
